About Holy Communion

St. Paul is a confessional Lutheran congregation sharing the beliefs and practices of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Following the Word of Jesus, we believe that the Lord's Supper is more than a symbol. Jesus gives His people His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins through the bread and wine. In Holy Communion, Jesus not only gives these gifts, He unites us in a confession of faith. We confess that God has given His gift of salvation in baptism. We confess that we are sinners who need the forgiveness that Jesus offers by His death and resurrection. We confess that God speaks in His inspired Word, the Bible. We confess that God is one God, the Father who created all things, the Son Jesus the Savior, and the Holy Spirit who dwells in His people by faith. Alongside this confession of faith, the Holy Spirit is at work in those who receive the Supper to live according to God's Word and remain true to God, even to death, shining Jesus' love inside and outside of God's church. If you share this confession, we invite you to receive Christ's body and blood with us. If you do not share these beliefs, please talk to a pastor before communing though you are invited to come forward during Communion distribution with arms crossed to receive a blessing and the assurance of God's love in Jesus Christ. We're glad you're at St. Paul!


WE TURN TO GOD, MINDFUL OF OUR SINFULNESS

Confession of Sins

- P: What makes you valuable? Your skills? Your talents? Your wealth? Your dedication? How we perform our work, how we live our lives, what we can produce or provide is often how the world measures value. Satan has tuned in to this concept. He is keenly aware that just the right situation may cause us to doubt our value, or fear that we are not admired—essentially, that we could be worthless if we're not careful.
 - Let us consider those times when our "value" was in question:
- C: Heavenly Father, even though we know we are Your precious children, we have allowed ourselves to be turned inward. We let the fear of falling behind or missing out drive us to do more and be better. We have cared little about what our neighbor might need; we have tried to connect our identity to fleeting things; we have followed after worldly choices for validation and approval. We have pushed ourselves to use comparison as our measure for success.
- P: Indeed, Satan's lie makes us look to ourselves to improve our circumstances. It tricks us into watching others only to make sure we are ahead. When Satan has his way, our actions are performed only for admiration.
- C: Forgive us, Father, for setting aside our humility, our patience, and our self-control. Strengthen us by Your Spirit to reject this lie, and seek our value only through Your eyes. Amen.

(We observe a moment of quiet reflection as we consider our own sinful condition)

- P: We live in a world that measures value and worth very differently from God. Earned success, status, and achievement are what the world looks for. But what if our true value is not earned? Satan whispers, "Your value is based on your performance." Yet God's Word tells a different story: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ... For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life."
- C: "And more than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation."
- P: Here we see the heart of God—a love that values us not for what we do, but for who we are in Him. Here is the liberating truth: You are not defined by your failures or achievements... rather solely by God's grace. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, in His place and by His authority, I forgive you for all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the H Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen!



PRAYER OF THE DAY Collect


P: Almighty and everlasting God, You created the world and filled it with abundant life that You treasure and love. Strengthen our spirit to dispel Satan's lie that we are valued only by our accomplishments. Turn us to Your Word—the Truth that shows Your love for us in the death and resurrection of Your Son, Jesus Christ—the One in whom we claim our true and lasting value; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

We Hear the Word of God

²² The same night [Jacob] arose and took his two wives, his two female servants, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and everything else that he had. ²⁴ And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day has broken." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." ²⁷ And he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." ²⁸ Then he said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed." ²⁹ Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. ³⁰ So Jacob called the name of the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life has been delivered." (ESV)

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: Thanks be to God.



³⁶ One of the Pharisees asked [Jesus] to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. ³⁷ And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, ³⁸ and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. ³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." ⁴⁰ And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it. Teacher."

⁴¹ "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" ⁴³ Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt." And he said to him, "You have judged rightly." ⁴⁴ Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. ⁴⁵ You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. ⁴⁶ You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. ⁴⁷ Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." ⁴⁸ And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." ⁴⁹ Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this, who even forgives sins?" ⁵⁰ And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." (ESV)

- P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
