### **About Holy Communion**

St. Paul is a confessional Lutheran congregation sharing the beliefs and practices of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Following the Word of Jesus, we believe that the Lord's Supper is more than a symbol. Jesus gives His people His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins through the bread and wine. In Holy Communion, Jesus not only gives these gifts, He unites us in a confession of faith. We confess that God has given His gift of salvation in baptism. We confess that we are sinners who need the forgiveness that Jesus offers by His death and resurrection. We confess that God speaks in His inspired Word, the Bible. We confess that God is one God. the Father who created all things, the Son Jesus the Savior, and the Holy Spirit who dwells in His people by faith. Alongside this confession of faith, the Holy Spirit is at work in those who receive the Supper to live according to God's Word and remain true to God, even to death, shining Jesus' love inside and outside of God's church. If you share this confession, we invite you to receive Christ's body and blood with us. If you do not share these beliefs, please talk to a pastor before communing though you are invited to come forward during Communion distribution with arms crossed to receive a blessing and the assurance of God's love in Jesus Christ. ### WE TURN TO GOD, MINDFUL OF OUR SINFULNESS

Confession of Sins

THE LIE: "Life will be better if you seize more control."

- P: Most of us prefer to be in control of our lives—making decisions, asserting authority. We know what's best, at least for ourselves. And when it's within reach, desiring just a little more power to maintain even more control and greater confidence is very attractive. However, Satan is very skilled, and cleverly twists our reasoning so that "seizing more power" begins to settle in as our normal way of thinking. There is a dangerous dividing line between power that is helpful and needed, and control that is abused.
  - With this in mind, let us consider our own desire for control and power:
- C: Heavenly Father, we are often slow to see or remember that You are the Creator of all things. You own everything. You manage everything. You provide everything. You have given us the task to steward Your creation. Without thinking, we have pursued more control over things that are not ours to manage. We have been drawn to even small gains in power—thinking, "we could do it better."
- P: This subtle lie of Satan fits easily into our self-centered minds... from our perspective, a little more power is better. However, it eventually leads us to distrust and contempt for others, and perhaps toward God Himself.
- C: Forgive us, Father, for all the times when "my will be done" was far from "Your will be done". Re-train our pride to live within Your gift of humility. Strengthen us by Your Spirit to reject Satan's lie, and daily acknowledge Your power in and above all things. Amen.

(We observe a moment of quiet reflection as we consider our own sinful condition)

- P: We crave control. We believe that if we just had more power over our lives, our circumstances, our future, even other people... things would be better. This is one of Satan's oldest lies: "Life will be better if you seize more control." But Jesus shows us a different way by rejecting the devil's temptation to take power for Himself and humbly surrendering to the Father's will: "The devil took [Jesus] to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. [And the devil said to Him,] 'All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me."
- C: "Jesus said to him, 'Be gone, Satan! For it is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve." Then the devil left Him."
- P: Jesus was given the opportunity to seize control of His own destiny—to avoid all the ugliness of human life and death. Satan's way would be much easier, but Jesus knew that such a choice would up-end the world to everlasting destruction, division, and violence. Instead, Jesus committed to everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness. He committed to the cross that brings eternal Life for all who would believe in Him. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, in His place and by His authority, I forgive you for all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the +1 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen!

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>19</sup> Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup> For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>21</sup> But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— <sup>22</sup> the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: <sup>23</sup> for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, <sup>24</sup> and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup> whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. 


