About Holy Communion

St. Paul is a confessional Lutheran congregation sharing the beliefs and practices of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Following the Word of Jesus, we believe that the Lord's Supper is more than a symbol. Jesus gives His people His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins through the bread and wine. In Holy Communion, Jesus not only gives these gifts, He unites us in a confession of faith. We confess that God has given His gift of salvation in baptism. We confess that we are sinners who need the forgiveness that Jesus offers by His death and resurrection. We confess that God speaks in His inspired Word, the Bible. We confess that God is one God, the Father who created all things, the Son Jesus the Savior, and the Holy Spirit who dwells in His people by faith. Alongside this confession of faith, the Holy Spirit is at work in those who receive the Supper to live according to God's Word and remain true to God, even to death, shining Jesus' love inside and outside of God's church. If you share this confession, we invite you to receive Christ's body and blood with us. If you do not share these beliefs, please talk to a pastor before communing though you are invited to come forward during Communion distribution with arms crossed to receive a blessing and the assurance of God's love in Jesus Christ. We're glad you're at St. Paul!

We Hear the Word of God

FIRST READING ✠ Exodus 3:1-15

¹ Now Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law, Jethro, the priest of Midian, and he led his flock to the west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. ² And the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush. He looked, and behold, the bush was burning, yet it was not consumed. ³ And Moses said, "I will turn aside to see this great sight, why the bush is not burned." ⁴ When the Lord saw that he turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." ⁵ Then he said, "Do not come near; take your sandals off your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." ⁶ And he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.



⁷ Then the Lord said, "I have surely seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters. I know their sufferings, ⁸ and I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the place of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. ⁹ And now, behold, the cry of the people of Israel has come to me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. ¹⁰ Come, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring my people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." ¹¹ But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" ¹² He said, "But I will be with you, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain."

¹³ Then Moses said to God, "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" ¹⁴ God said to Moses, "I am who I am." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I am has sent me to you.'" ¹⁵ God also said to Moses, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.' This is my name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations." (ESV)

HOLY GOSPEL ✠ John 15:1-17

¹ [Jesus said,] "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not abide in me, he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. ⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

¹² This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷ These things I command you, so that you will love one another." (ESV)

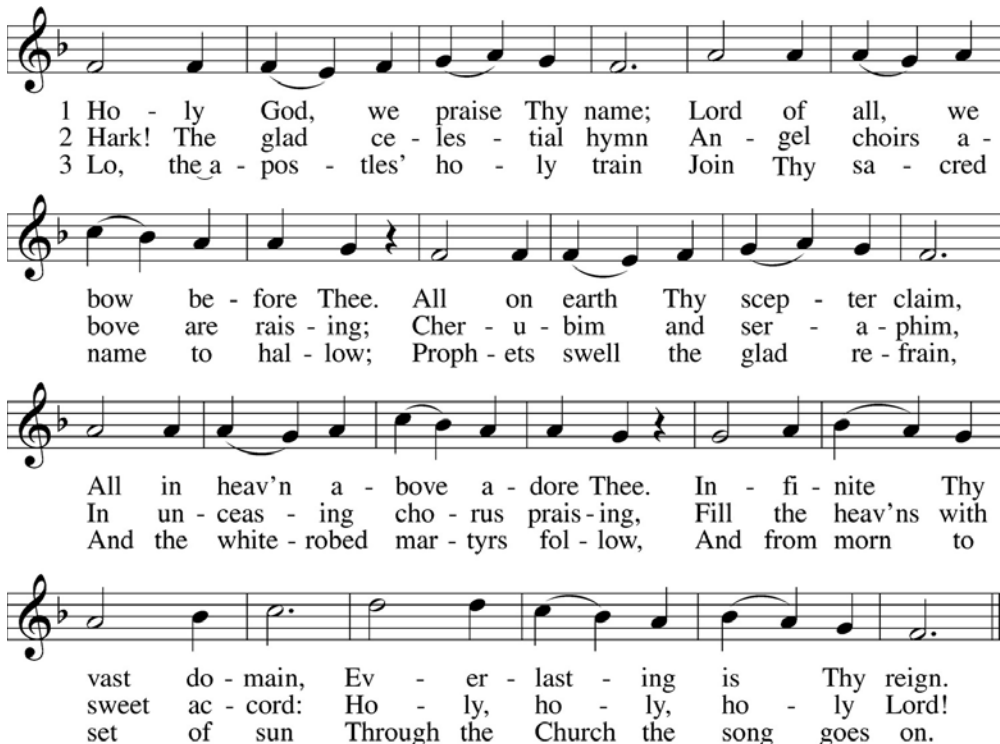

WE TURN TO GOD, MINDFUL OF OUR SINFULNESS

Confession of Sins

THE LIE: "You are alone."

- P: Many of Satan's lies are designed to falsely build up our self-image and self-reliance: "we are stronger and have the power to do and achieve all that is desirable to us." Satan also knows we are very vulnerable to pain—especially mental and emotional pain. The feeling of loneliness can spiral our thinking away from everything, including God. In times of struggle, fear, or uncertainty, Satan whispers: "You are alone", and we begin to wonder...

Let us consider when being alone has pushed us further away from God and others, as this lie draws us to look to ourselves or self-destructive answers for "help".

- C: **Heavenly Father, being alone and isolated is painful. You created us to be connected with You and one another. But when we have faced difficult times, we have heard Satan's temptation. He has encouraged us to find comfort in being alone; to accept that we have strength in ourselves. And our thoughts begin to wander away from Your protection. We soon forget Your promises, driving us deeper into sorrow and despair.**
- P: Satan enjoys this lie because it takes very little effort to plant the thought of being alone. We do all the work by letting the fear of isolation and rejection eat away at the truth. He delights when we distance ourselves from family and friends...and hopefully from God.
- C: **Father, forgive us those times when we have forgotten Your promise to be with us always. Forgive us when we have neglected others who have struggled and caused them to feel alone. Forgive our lack of assurance when we worry needlessly, when we think ourselves unworthy, when we believe everything and everyone will fail us. Repeat Your promise of love for Your people; remind us that You will always look for us and find us when we are lost. Amen.**

(We observe a moment of quiet reflection as we consider our own sinful condition)

GOD TURNS TO US, EAGER TO FORGIVE

Absolution
(with Matthew 28:20b; Revelation 21:3)

- P: By His very name, *Immanuel*— ‘*God with us*’, we have constant assurance that Jesus abides with us. We have His great promise: “*Behold, I am with you always, to the very end of the age.*” While Satan drives us to isolate ourselves, Jesus seeks us again and again; He brings us into community; and in His return on the Last Day, His presence will be with us in the new creation forever.
- C: ***“I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God.”***
- P: God’s love and compassion for His people is always and ever. When we were wandering and alone, dead in our sinfulness, God showed us the Truth. He sent Jesus. The One whose death and resurrection cancels our debt of sin, and restores us into fellowship with God—where we will never be alone. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, in His place and by His authority, I forgive you for all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the ☩ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: **Amen!**

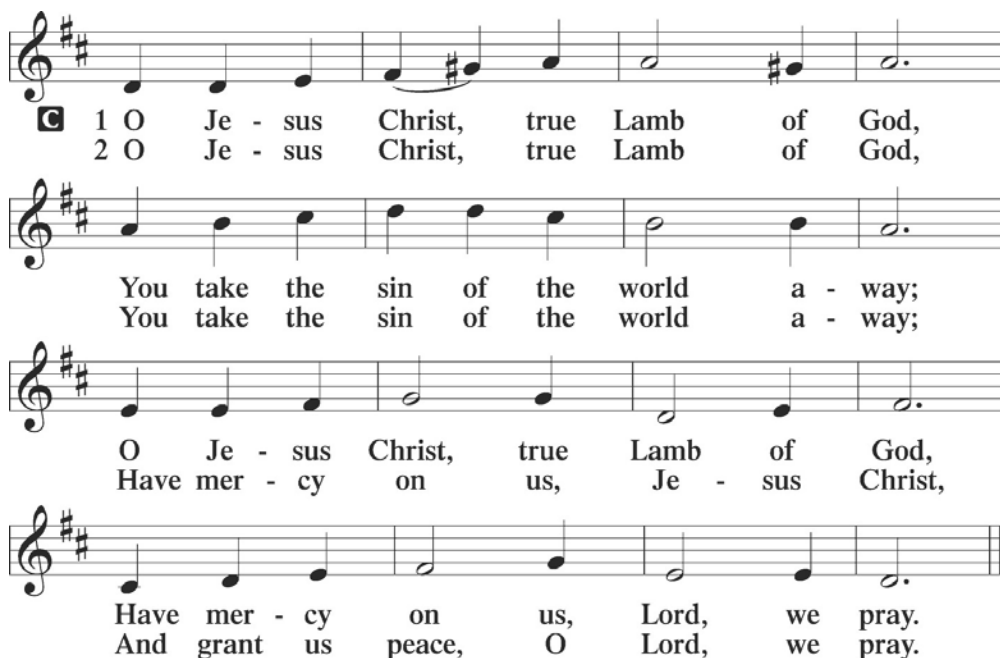
