About Holy Communion

St. Paul is a confessional Lutheran congregation sharing the beliefs and practices of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Following the Word of Jesus, we believe that the Lord's Supper is more than a symbol. Jesus gives His people His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins through the bread and wine. In Holy Communion, Jesus not only gives these gifts, He unites us in a confession of faith. We confess that God has given His gift of salvation in baptism. We confess that we are sinners who need the forgiveness that Jesus offers by His death and resurrection. We confess that God speaks in His inspired Word, the Bible. We confess that God is one God, the Father who created all things, the Son Jesus the Savior, and the Holy Spirit who dwells in His people by faith. Alongside this confession of faith, the Holy Spirit is at work in those who receive the Supper to live according to God's Word and remain true to God, even to death, shining Jesus' love inside and outside of God's church. If you share this confession, we invite you to receive Christ's body and blood with us. If you do not share these beliefs, please talk to a pastor before communing though you are invited to come forward during Communion distribution with arms crossed to receive a blessing and the assurance of God's love in Jesus Christ. We're glad you're at St. Paul!

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

(with Isaiah 40:3,5; Exodus 6:6,7)

P: A voice calls: "In the desert, prepare the way for the Lord.

C: **Make straight paths for Him, a highway for our God."**

P: "Say therefore to the people of Israel, 'I am the Lord, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians...

C: **I will deliver you from slavery to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment"**



P: Our Advent wreath and candles are a symbol we use during the season of Advent. Four candles encircle the white Christ Candle in the center. This signifies that God is eternal—without beginning or end, an everlasting Love. The blue candles symbolize our HOPE and expectation of Jesus' coming. The pink candle, often identified as the "JOY" candle, is lit on the third Sunday in Advent, reminding us to "*rejoice, the Lord is near!*" The light from the candles shows us that Jesus Christ is the Light that has come into the world to dispel all darkness. The first candle we light today reminds us that God comes to us with comfort and peace in the humble and simple times: He brings comfort to the discomfited and hope to the hopeless.

C: **"I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God, and you shall know that I am the Lord your God, who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians."**

WE TURN TO GOD, MINDFUL OF OUR SINFULNESS

Confession of Sins

(with Isaiah 2:3)

- P: God once spoke through the prophet Isaiah to comfort His people with the assurance of pardon and a joyful return to their home. After the time of their exile, God Himself would restore them, renew them, and return them to the land He had promised them on oath to their forefathers.
- C: **"Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that He may teach us His ways and that we may walk in His paths."**
- P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, our Lord has promised to return to this earth in power and glory, to put this age to an end, and to bring home with Him all who trust in His promise. As we anticipate the Day of His coming, we are drawn to confess that we have not always been faithful to His will, nor have we taken advantage of opportunities to share the message of His Gospel. We have not demonstrated His love to those around us. We have not honored Him with our hearts and minds and lives. Let us reflect on our sins and ask for His forgiveness.
- C: **Most merciful God, we confess to You that our sinful ways keep us exiled. We have praised and welcomed You with our lips, but have also dishonored and disobeyed You with our thoughts, words, and actions. We carry grudges, speak spiteful words, and are indifferent to the struggle of others— all these things have been tools that war against the people You love; and we have not lived in true peace. For the sake of Jesus, our Savior, forgive us. In Your mercy and grace, lead us out of the darkness of our sin, and onto the path of Your light. Amen.**

(We observe a moment of quiet reflection as we consider our own sinful condition)

¹ Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, “Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, ‘The Lord needs them,’ and he will send them at once.” ⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, ⁵ “Say to the daughter of Zion, ‘Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.’” ⁶ The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. ⁷ They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. ⁸ Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, “Hosanna to the Son of David! 
